European Union Corn: Extreme High Temperatures and Drought Reduces Crop European Union (EU) (MY) 2022/23 corn production is forecast at 60.0 million metric tons (mmt), down 12 percent from last month, 15 percent below last year's crop, and 10 percent below the 5- year



On July 22, 2022, delegations from Ukraine, Turkey, Russia, and the United Nations signed an agreement to provide safe passage for grains from select Ukrainian ports (Odesa, Chornomorsk, Pyvdenny), offering a potential corridor for movement of Ukrainian grain through the Black average. Area is estimated at 9.0 million hectares (mha), down 1 percent from last month and 3 percent from last year, but 3 percent above the 5-year average of 8.8 mha. Yield is estimated at 6.67 tons per hectare, down 11 percent from last month, 13 percent from last year, and 12 percent from the 5-year average



Ukraine and Russia sign UN-backed deal to restart grain exports

Ukraine and Russia have signed a UN-backed deal to allow the export of millions of tonnes of grain from blockaded Black Sea ports, potentially averting the threat of a catastrophic global food crisis. A signing ceremony at Dolmabahçe Palace in Istanbul was attended by the UN secretary general, António Guterres, and Recep Tayyip Erdoğan, Turkey's president, who had played a key role during months of tense negotiations.





Turkey plans to import more wheat in 2022-23 to meet domestic food and feed demand, strengthen country stocks and meet stable demand from wheat product producers and exporters, according to a report from the Foreign Agricultural Service of the US Department of Agriculture (USDA). Imports are forecast at 10.25 million tonnes, up from 9.4 million tonnes in 2021-22. Main suppliers included Russia with 6.3 million tonnes, Ukraine with 2 million tonnes, Moldova with 400,000 tonnes and Brazil with 125,000 tonnes.







First Ukrainian grain ship leaves Odesa under brokered deal

The first ship carrying Ukrainian grain under a deal brokered by Turkey and the United Nations left the port of Odesa on Aug. 1, carrying 26,000 tonnes of corn destined for Lebanon, The Associated Press reported. The food security of millions of people is at stake as more than 20 million tonnes of grain sit in Ukrainian silos at the Black Sea port of Odesa and ships are stranded due to the Russian blockade that began with its invasion of Ukraine on Feb. 24. Russia and Ukraine signed separate agreements on July 22 with Turkey and the UN clearing the way for Ukraine to export grain and other agricultural goods while allowing Russia to export grain and fertilizers.

IGC lowers global wheat flour trade forecast

The world's top flour exporter, Turkey, is poised to export just over 5 million tonnes in 2022-23, according to the IGC, which would be its highest total since the 2018-19 season. Kazakhstan is projected to see a slight drop in flour exports, shipping 2.2 million tonnes this year, 50,000 tonnes less than in 2021-22.




.On July 22, Ukraine and Russia signed agreements with Turkey and the United Nations designed to restore the export of grain from Ukrainian ports. The deal stipulates that Kyiv can export grain from the Odesa, Chornomorsk, and Yuzhne ports on the Black Sea. However, Ukraine will not remove the mines protecting its ports: ships will travel through safe clearways instead. In addition, the Russian side will be involved in inspecting ships destined for Ukraine's ports for any weapons.

vegetables and vegetable products (3), meat and meat products (2), cereals and cereal based products (1), egg (1), food additives (1), milk and dairy products (1), non-alcoholic beverages (1), and one unknown.
