World wheat trade is now forecast to expand by 1.8 percent in 2021/22, reaching a new record level of 192 million tonnes, underpinned by larger imports anticipated for Afghanistan, Iraq, the Islamic Republic of Iran and Turkey to compensate for reduced domestic production, as well as for Egypt to replenish stocks.



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
