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World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates



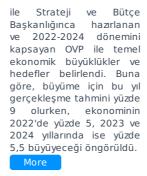

The outlook for 2021/22 U.S. wheat this month is for reduced supplies, slightly higher domestic use, unchanged exports, and decreased ending stocks. Supplies are reduced as imports are lowered 10 million bushels to 135 million on the import pace. Food use is raised 2 million bushels to 964 million, reflecting an upward revision of 2020/21 food use.

Crop monitoring in Europe August 2021

Weather conditions in the EU, and the associated impacts on yield expectations have been quite contrasting. However, changes to crop yield forecasts at the EU level, are very limited.

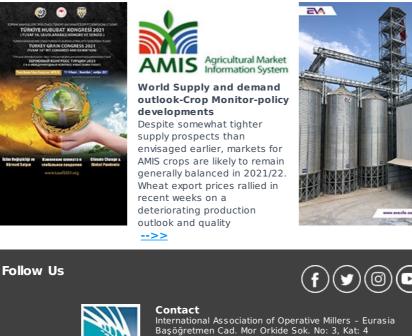
EU-level yield outlook remains above average Summer crops negatively impacted in southern Europe but improved in the west

Persistent drought conditions in several major producing countries have resulted in a 29.3 million tonne cut to FAO's 2021 cereal production forecast since the previous report in July, now pegged at 2 788 million tonnes. Notwithstanding this reduction, global cereal production is still projected to grow by 0.7 percent

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
